Romans 15:14-16:27

The Gospel, the good news about how we are made right with God, is for ALL to hear. Paul was very eager to tell all people where ever he went but he had a special calling and concern for Gentiles (non-Jews). He ran into opposition but this didn't stop him. He was equally concerned to help them be accepted and welcomed into the life of the Church. We can learn from Paul's wisdom as servants to of Christ and the Gospel.

Seek to reach all - Think inclusive and beyond the local church.

Support financially churches and ministries - Budget to give.

Chapter 15:23-29

Pray for God's work and workers.

Chapter 15:30-33

Be a welcoming church – Greet and gather.

Chapter 16:1-16,21-24

Make every effort to do what leads to peace and mutual edification.

Chapter 16:17-24

Trust in God and give Him the glory.

Chapter 16:25-27

A Bible Study – Romans 15:1-16:27**18**

Open with a prayer asking God to teach you from His word:**Question:**

How can we show our thankfulness to God for the Gospel and for those who made it known to us? How can we share it and support it?

Read: Romans 15:14-22.**Read:** Romans 15:23-29.**Read:** Romans 15:30-33.**Read:** Romans 16:1-16,21-24**Read:** Romans 16:17-20.**Read:** Romans 16:25-27.**Close with prayer.**
